Speaker Biography - Dr. Jean Patel

Dr. Patel joined Beckman Coulter Microbiology after nearly seventeen years at the Center for Disease Control (CDC) in the Antimicrobial Resistance Reference Laboratory and the Office of Antimicrobial Resistance. Prior to that, she was the Assistant Professor of Pathology and Laboratory Medicine, and the Assistant Director of Clinical Microbiology at the University of Pennsylvania. Dr. Patel is known worldwide for her expertise and publications in the area of antimicrobial susceptibility testing. She has held many roles with the Clinical Laboratory and Standards Institute (CLSI), including the Chairholder of the Subcommittee for Antimicrobial Susceptibility Testing. She has been a member of the Trans-Atlantic Task Force on Antimicrobial Resistance and leads a World Health Organization Collaborating Center on Antimicrobial Resistance. Dr. Patel has served as the editor for *Clinical Microbiology Reviews*, on the editorial board for the *Journal of Clinical Microbiology* and as section editor for the ASM *Manual of Clinical Microbiology*. Dr. Patel is the author of over 50 peer-reviewed publications. Dr. Patel received her Bachelor's degree from Marquette University and her Ph.D. from Emory University.

Two key elements of a sustainable process improvement project are a structured approach to managing modifications to the process and a change management plan to ensure employees are going to support and comply with the revised process.
